## Maggie makes a splash

Waterfalls continue to be the most asked for feature of Maggie Valley.

There are some spectacular water features that are a close drive from the valley. Though you won't find any near the Valley floor, you wont have to go far. Here are some of our favorites:


**SOCO FALLS** · Soco Falls is located just past the Blue Ridge Parkway on the way to Cherokee. There is a small sign that indicates the parking area on the left of the road. The trail is short but steep that leads to an observation platform overlooking the unique double falls.

MINGO FALLS - Mingo Falls is on the Cherokee Indian Reservation (Qualla Boundary), just outside Great Smoky Mountains National Park. No special permits are required for access to the reservation. At 120 feet tall, the waterfall is one of the tallest and most spectacular in the southern Appalachians.

**GRAVEYARD FIELDS WATERFALLS** - Just off the Blue Ridge Parkway heading north, the hiking area includes two beautiful waterfalls, the multi-tiered second falls and the tall cascades of the upper falls. The trails meander through valley that was once used for grazing cattle around the turn of the last century. The hikes are moderate.





**SAFETY** - As with any water feature, the trails, rocks and surrounding areas are often wet and slippery. Use caution whenever hiking around water.

## **VALLEY FISHING**

Maggie Valley is a state designated Heritage Frout Waters area.

The Mountain Heritage Trout Waters Program was established by the NC General Assembly in 2007 as a means to encourage trout fishing as a heritage tourism activity. Maggie Valley is designated as one of five Mountain Heritage Trout Cities in this pilot program.



Mountain Heritage Trout Waters provide quality fishing opportunities in the Maggie Vallev area. The NC Wildlife Resources Commission which sells the Mountain Heritage Trout Waters license, gives anglers two quick and easy ways to purchase a license: www.ncwildlife.org or by phone: on-line: 888-248-6834. The license is valid for a 3-day period and costs: \$5 for residents and non-residents age 16 and older. The license is valid only for waters that are designated as Mountain Heritage Trout Waters.

Elk were once abundant throughout the United States, but by the mid-1800's, overhunting and habitat loss wiped out eastern elk herds. In 2001, the Rocky Mountain Elk Foundation, the National Park Service and other partners joined together to restore wild elk to the Smoky Mountains in the Cataloochee Valley near Maggie Valley. The initial 52 elk that were released have grown to a herd of almost 200.

#### Viewing the Elk

Most elk are located in the Cataloochee Valley area in the southeastern section of the Great Smoky Mountains National Park. While the best times to view elk are usually early morning and late evening, elk may also be active on cloudy summer days and before or after storms. As the elk have begun to migrate out of the park you can frequently see elk in and around Maggie Valley.

#### The Elk Seasons

**Winter:** Elk wear a two-layer coat during the colder months. Long guard hairs on the top repel water and a soft, wooly underfur keeps them warm. Elk may move from the high country to valleys to feed.

**Spring:** Most elk shed their antlers in March. The antlers, which are rich in calcium, are quickly eaten by rodents and other animals.

**Summer:** Most calves are born in early June. Male elk roll in mud wallows to keep cool and avoid insect pests.

Fall: The elk's fall breeding season is known as the rut (mid September through the end of October). The mating call of bulls is called a bugle and can be heard during the breeding season. Even if the elk are not present, people are not allowed to walk into the fields. During the rut, male elk make bugling calls to challenge other bulls and attract cows. Dominant bulls use the fields to gather and breed with harems of up to 20 cows. Bull elk actively defend their territory by charging and sparring with competitors using their antlers to intimidate and spar with other males. Encroaching too close may lead a bull to perceive you or your vehicle as a threat causing them to charge.




#### Safety

When elk are present, federal regulations require that you remain at least 150 feet away and at a distance that does not disturb them. Failure to do so can result in fines and/or arrests. Even if the elk are not present, people are not allowed to walk into the fields. During the rut, male elk make bugling calls to challenge other bulls and attract cows. Dominant bulls use the fields to gather and breed with harems of up to 20 cows. Bull elk actively defend their territory by charging and sparring with competitors using their antlers to intimidate and spar with other males. Encroaching too close may lead a bull to perceive you or your vehicle as a threat causing them to charge.

#### **Directions to Cataloochee Valley**

From Maggie Valley, take US 19 (Soco Road) east toward Waynesville. Turn left onto US 276 North (Jonathan Creek Road) Go about six miles and turn left onto Cove Creek Road, the last left turn before coming to 1-40 intersection. When the road forks, keep right. Cove Creek is a steep, ten-mile, narrow, curving mountain road. There is a three-mile paved section leading up and over Cove Creek Gap, and then winding down the other side of the mountain. When you again reach pavement, turn left and enjoy your easy descent into the valley. The road can be treacherous after heavy rains or with snow.







#### ART LOEB TRAIL

Length: 12.3 miles Rating: Strenuous

The Art Loeb Trail, 30.1 miles long, is a national recreation trail and named after a local hiking enthusiast. The trail traverses beautiful, but rugged terrain, from some of the lowest, to some of the highest points on the Pisgah District. Most of the Art Loeb Trail is overlapped by the Mountains-to-the Sea Trail. It begins at the Davidson River and climbs steeply to Shut-in Ridge. Once up, don't expect that the hard part is over. This trail will take you up and down knobs, along ridges and down into several gaps.

Directions: Go 0.2 mile south of Pisgah District Ranger Station on U.S. Highway 276, and turn onto the road to Davidson River Campground. Park in the Art Loeb Trailhead parking lot. The other end of this section is at Gloucester Gap on FS Rd. 471, where overnight parking is not recommended.

#### **GRAVEYARD FIELDS**

Length: 3.2 miles Rating: Easy

This is a popular family hiking trail because of its beauty and ease. This is a moderate climb of almost a mile to the base of an impressive waterfalls. A map at the parking area shows the Graveyard Fields trail system. The set of steps to the right of the map is the start of the trail. After crossing the bridge, the main trail goes left and upstream. A 0.25-mile trail to the right will take you to the bottom of the Lower Falls, which is a moderate descent. Rocks around waterfalls are very slippery. The main trail will take you through open, grassy areas, and past nice pools for wading on a hot summer day. Blueberries are abundant in the fall. After one mile, you will see the trail to the Upper Falls. The main trail crosses the Yellow stone Prong and returns to the parking lot

Directions: This trail begins at the Graveyard Fields Overlook on the Blue Ridge Parkway.

From the U.S. Highway 276 junction with the Parkway, turn left or south on the Parkway and continue to milepost 418.8 (about 6 miles).

#### **BOOGERMAN TRAIL**

Length: 4.2 miles Rating: Easy

This moderate, 4-mile hiking trail has an elevation gain of only 900 feet. It is well known for the variety of magnificent trees. The trailhead is on Caldwell Fork Trail. After leaving Caldwell Fork, the trail ascends a low ridge to a gap, slabs (runs across the mountain slope with only gradual elevation change) the mountainside with only two additional short climbs, reaches a side ridge, and descends back to Caldwell Fork. It is best to do this trail as a day hike from Cataloochee Campground, a 7.5-mile roundtrip.

Directions: Take exit 20 off I-40 (Cove

Creek) and travel west on NC 276 turn right on Cove Creek road. Stay on Cove Creek Rd. for 6 miles. This will take you 2 miles beyond park boundary. Turn left on Cataloochee Road, go 3.1 miles. Trail will be on the left.


#### **BUCKEYE RIDGE TRAIL**

Length: 5.4 miles Rating: Moderate

This hiking trail winds through grassy fields and wooded areas. It provides panoramic views of the countryside in some spots. Cold Springs Creek flows through dense woods and grassy fields on its way to the Pigeon River. The forest shows hints of its past history~farming, logging, narrow gauge railroads, settlements, and signs of recent forest management. The grassy ridges of Max Patch Mountain near the Tennessee state line crown the area. Trails combined with forest service roads to provide loop opportunities.



#### BLUERIDGE PARKWAY HIKES Milepost 418.8: Graveyard Fields

A short downhill hike (partly paved) leads to one of three waterfalls. A popular hiking destination, Graveyard Fields morphs into a wild blueberry field calling people from afar due to its sweeping views and ripening patch in late summer and fall, so bring your buckets.

#### Milepost 420: Black Balsam Knob

This section of trails includes some of the most spectacular

mountains and balds in the Southern Appalachians, including Black Balsam Knob, Sam Knob, and Tennent Mountain. These treeless mountaintops draw alpine appearance.

**Milepost 422.4: Devil's Courthouse** According to Cherokee folklore, the devil holds court in a cave on the mountain, where a walk to the bare rock summit is worth every step.

**Milepost 431: Richland Balsam Overlook** The highest point on the entire Parkway at 6,053 feet, the Richland Balsam overlook also offers a beautiful 1.5-mile self-guided loop trail.

**Milepost 451.2: Waterrock Knob** Waterrock Knob Visitor Center sits at nearly 6,000 feet and offers exhibits, book sales, restrooms and a 1.2 mile roundtrip trail leading to the summit of Waterrock Knob for an almost 360 degree view of the Smoky Mountains.

The two most popular rides are the pedestrian trail around Lake Junaluska which is perfect for the novice or family, and the Blue Ridge Parkway for the seasoned road rider. Some of the park trails allow bikes including Cade's Cove Auto Loop. Another hidden favorite is the Balsam Mountain Road off the Blue Ridge Parkway from the picnic area at Balsam Mountain - 22 miles to Round Bottom Road, it's 99% downhill so not much peddling is needed. Check ahead with the park service to make sure you're good to go. 

Meet the Original Maggie
They named this now famous resort community for a pretty 14-year old mountain girl with

They named this now famous resort community for a pretty 14-year old mountain girl with long blond hair and deep blue eyes. To know her story and the real Maggie, you must read *Maggie of Maggie Valley, NC*, a book written by her daughter Patty Pylant Kosier.

It's the chronicle not only of Maggie Mae Setzer Pylant but mountain life when this was still an isolated settlement in the wilderness. Ten years after Maggie was born on December 21, 1890, her father, Jack Setzer started thinking that the community ought to have a post office. He wanted to establish a post office in his home because he was tired of hiring someone to ride 5 miles to the Plott post office to pick up mail for the valley. Jack Setzer wrote to the US postal department for permission to establish his home as a new post office that would serve the area. He was told to provide service that was needed by the settlements for the next six months, he kept careful records. One corner of Setzers room was a post office in which he built a wooden box to file the incoming letters and newspaper. At the end of six months, Jack submitted his records to the post office department and they accepted his application

the postal service. The first three names that he submitted were rejected because they had already been used for other NC post offices. Jack then submitted the three names of his daughters Cora, Mettie and Maggie Mae plus the name Jonathan Creek, the creek that ran through the Setzer's home. Jack didn't tell his daughters that he submitted their names. On May 10, 1904, Jack received an official letter from the US Postmaster General Frank Hitchcock that the post office authorities had made their decision. The official name of the mountain settlement post office was to be Maggie, NC. Maggie was embarrassed when she was told the news. She burst into tears and ran up the mountain to the old log cabin where she had been born. At the age of 17, Maggie became the bride of Ira Pylant of Nashville, TN. They moved to Texas, but she came back to her beloved valley several times before her death in 1979 at the age of 88.
